The Plumers moved in 1928 to Perry, the County Seat of Noble County, OK






Betty Age 11: Bike Mechanic










Huddling against the Cold with her cat Driftwood in the Unfinished La Mesa House - 1948









1973 – Bob and Betty buy a home they really love: 302 Margon Ct., Slidell LA. Betty plants an oak sapling in the front yard.




1970s – Betty tries to revive her sewing career in Slidell

1975 – But at age 55, Betty finds her true calling: Tennis




1980 – Betty co-founds the Northshore Women's Tennis League, competes regularly with younger women. Here is her winning team in 1999:

In 1985, Bob dies while on a family visit to California






During her 32-year widowhood, Betty plays tennis, enjoys life with her friends, and travels extensively, often with her beloved sister, Aleen.
